Fatimah Husein is affiliated with the State Islamic University of Yogyakarta, the oldest and one of the best institutions of Islamic Higher Education in Indonesia. She was awarded her PhD in Asian studies from The University of Melbourne in 2004, and Master degree in Islamic philosophy from McGill University (Montreal, Canada) in 1997.
